Left calls it right: 12-hour strike

With Congress, they will protest high-handed police posture

The enthusiasm of students of West Bengal who were scheduled to attend their schools after a year from February 12 got spoilt as the Left Front and Congress called for a 12-hour strike following the lathi-charge of the Kolkata Police on the members of the Left Front student wing during their march to the West Bengal secretariat.

Demanding employment and industrialisation, 10 student union wings of the Left Front on Thursday started their protest rally towards Nabanna, but the congregation was stopped at the Esplanade area of Central

Kolkata. When the student wings tried to break open the barricades, the police used lathis and water cannons on

them and fired tear gas leaving several CPI (M) cadres injured. Several students were ad-

mitted to SSKM and Kolkata Medical College hospitals.

Talking to the Free Press Journal, Aditi Sinha Roy of SFI said that the police had manhandled women students and tried to disrupt the rally intentionally.

"Several exams are due. Future of many students is uncertain and despite passing exams most of us are jobless. So, we were taking our protest to Nabanna. The police suddenly became aggressive and first fired tear gas," mentioned a student who sustained a leg injury.

A section of protesting students was also seen chanting anti-state government slogans in front of the North gate of the state secretariat. They were arrested.

Mamata 'takes stock' of Shah son's money

Addressing an audience at Uttirna, Mamata slammed Shah and said, "If you state

that we have siphoned money, first prove it. Or, resign. You continuously attack us with pisi-bhaipo (aunt-nephew) jibe, what about your son? Where did he get so much money from? I am good otherwise, but if you try to play with me I will give back. He is in West Bengal today and all of them are looking so devilish."

Time and again the BJP leaders were heard calling Abhishek Banerjee 'an extortionist'.

Grounded unceremoniously

"The government has taken serious note and the CM has directed to affix responsibility on the concerned official from the Raj Bhavan for not taking due care and causing inconvenience to the Governor," said the statement issued by the CM's Secretariat.

In October last year, Koshyari and CM Thackeray were engaged in a major war of words over the reopening of places of worship in the state, which had been shut since March, in the wake of lockdown following coronavirus. Koshyari had written a sarcastic letter, calling the chief minister a "votary of Hindutva who had turned secular." Thackeray had strongly refuted the governor's statement saying that he did not need a "certificate" of Hindutva from him.

Then, in May, there was a faceoff between the state government and the governor over the state cabinet's recommendation to nominate CM Thackeray to the state legislative council. Thackeray was facing a constitutional issue as he had to get elected to either of the two houses of legislature within six months of his swearing in as the CM, which took place in November 2019.

Koshyari's decisions to convene a meeting with government officers on various issues, including the handling of the coronavirus pandemic also came under attack from the state government.

The governor had objected to the state government's decision to not hold final-year examinations due to the coronavirus pandemic but allowing the students to pass with an average of their scores that far. Koshyari met actor Kangana Ranaut who had complained to him against the Sena-ruled civic body's move to demolish parts of her office. He also met a retired naval officer who was assaulted by Sena workers for circulating a post against the CM on social media.

EC to extend polling time by an hour

Chief Election Commissioner Sunil Arora on Thursday announced the polling hours would be extended by an hour in Tamil Nadu and other States that are bound for Assembly polls this summer.

Arora, who led a full team of the Election Commission of India on a two-day visit to Chennai, said the decision to extend polling time during the COVID-19 global pandemic was taken on representations from political parties.



"We discussed this and because of the physical distancing norms [that has to be followed as part of COVID safety protocol], we have decided to extend by one hour," he told journalists. He, however, added that "the exact hours" will be announced along with the poll notification.

In another significant announcement, the CEC said that it has been decided to ap-

point the coordinator of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) to the apex committee that decides where central forces must be deployed during elections. Until now such "randomisation" of central forces' deployment was done by the State governments. Arora said this arrangement would not just be applicable for the five poll-bound States [West Bengal, Kerala, Assam and Union Territory of Puducherry being the rest] but for the whole of India henceforth.

Notwithstanding opposition from many political parties, the CEC indicated that the poll body would go ahead with its decision of allowing those aged above 80 year to cast votes via postal ballots. He said during the recent Assembly elections in Bihar, the EC did not encounter any charges of malpractice in registration of postal ballots by senior citizens.

Acharya's tweet adds to Gehlot-Pilot rift

The tumult in Rajasthan Congress refuses to die down. The latest hullabaloo has been caused by a tweet from Acharya Pramod Krishnam giving his blessings to former Rajasthan deputy chief minister Sachin Pilot to become chief minister.

Pilot is these days holding 'kisan sammelans' in eastern Rajasthan, ostensibly as part of Congress' effort to reach out to farmers who are agitating against the central farm laws.

Enthusied by the huge turnout at the meetings, the

Pilot camp is pushing this as an indication of his continued popularity despite attempts by the Gehlot camp to sideline him.

Analysts say while Pilot might be flexing his muscles as a signal to the party leadership, by confining himself to eastern Rajasthan, which is a Gurjar dominated area, Pilot runs the risk of being seen as a Gurjar leader.

Pilot had shared a photo on Twitter of himself addressing a mammoth meeting in Jasaur village in Bharatpur district. Replying to Pilot's tweet, Krishnam wrote 'mukhyamantri bhava'. This is being interpreted in

political circles as Acharya Krishnam's open blessings for Sachin Pilot to become chief minister of Rajasthan.

The tweet has not gone down well with loyalists of chief minister Ashok Gehlot.

On Tuesday, Gehlot had put out a video message for the Congress's 'Join Congress Social Media campaign', in which he said the youth should come forward and take part in the campaign and put the correct picture before the public. "We can put our views before the public through social media which is much needed at a time when the media is under pressure.

WILL JD(S) CONTEST BYPOLLS?

The JD(S) sent confusing signals on contesting the bypolls in Karnataka. While JD(S) supreme HD Deve Gowda did not want the party to contest the bypolls and said that the JD(S) will not be fielding candidates, his son and former chief minister HD Kumaraswamy categorically stated that the party will contest from at least two assembly segments. Among the three assembly constituencies going to bypolls, JD(S) has considerable support in Basavakalyan and Sindagi.

Gowda's stand triggered speculations of a tacit understanding with the BJP as it came just a day after his party senior, MLC Basavaraj Horatti, was elected to the legislative council chairman post. In a tactical move, the BJP provided support for Horatti's win. But Gowda put up a weak defence saying "I'm now working to save the regional party and my focus till the next election will be the same."

Blackbuck poaching: Relief for actor

A Jodhpur court on Thursday provided relief to actor Salman Khan by dismissing a Rajasthan government plea in an 18-year-old case relating to submitting a false affidavit in court. The Jodhpur district and sessions court judge

Raghavendra Kachhawa dismissed a plea by the state government seeking prosecution of Khan under the Arms Act for keeping arms with an expired license and using the arms for poaching. Khan was present through the hearing through video conferencing. After the court's verdict, Khan's advocate Hastimal Saraswat

said after years of hearings, we have finally got justice. He said that this is the second time that a petition in the case has been dismissed by a court. In 2019, the chief judicial magistrate (CJM) court too dismissed a petition by the prosecution to lodge a case against Khan. The prosecution had challenged the CJM court order in the sessions court.

Social media giants warned

This, in turn, will necessitate the appointment for a chief compliance officer who will respond on a 24x7 basis to any complaint from law enforcement agencies and submit regular reports on compliance. At the same time, there will be a grievance redressal mechanism portal and an oversight mechanism, sources told NDTV.

The oversight mechanism will be developed by the government, which will "coordinate adherence to a Code of Ethics by publishers and self-regulating bodies". A Secretary-rank officer will have the powers to take action in case of an emergency and place it before the committee within 48 hours, it is proposed. Sites will have 36 hours to remove content flagged either by a court or a designated body.

Giving an idea of the thinking in government circles, Prasad told the House that social media platforms were adhering to dual standards. They had allowed circulation of hate messages, following the violence on Republic Day, but the same platforms had followed a restrictive policy following the violence at Capitol Hill in the United States.

There cannot be two standards, one in the United States and another in India, Prasad said, adding that the time has come to tell those running popular social media platforms that they have to abide by the laws of the land and that the transgressors will be punished alike other criminals.

The government had ticked off Twitter on Wednesday for not complying with its order to take down accounts that it alleges are spreading misinformation about farmers' protests. Twitter said in a public blog post that it had not fully complied with the government's order because it believed some of the blocking orders were not consistent with Indian law. It said it would not block accounts of journalists, activists, and politicians.

No more pantry cars on trains unless it is Tejas

"We will continue providing the best of cooked food to our passengers, which is a good way to attract footfall," said a railway official.

Train travel is not just about the commute and the passing sights but also the meals on wheels served to passengers. One of the delectable aspects of the journeys on the Rajdhani and the Shatabdi is for their food as well. "Passengers want hot cooked food served. But the rail ministry is still maintaining that ready-to-eat food will be served to passengers," said a member of the IRMCA.

According to railway officials, the pantry system in long-distance trains has been more or less disbanded and people will have to either carry their own food or book through e-catering or buy ready-to-eat (RTE) food served in these trains. The idea going the rounds in the railways is to convert the pantry car into a 3-tier AC coach that will ferry more passengers, with just a side pantry to warm ready-to-eat food.

"Train travel is also a great way of promoting tourism. Food served to passengers plays an important role and so pantries need to continue," said AV Sheny.

Sources said that the railways are slowly disbanding the pantry car services in trains and are encouraging e-catering, which too resumed from February 1. As per figures, since February 1, there were 9,650 bookings through e-catering, of which 4,600 were delivered, bringing in a revenue of over Rs 13 lakh.

Almost 50 per cent of the total e-catering food ordered is vegetarian and non-vegetarian thalis and the rest is Chinese, pizza, biryani/pulav and chaat items. Last October, Tejas Express had begun operations only to discontinue it because of the increase in Covid-19 cases.

Priyanka takes dip at Sangam

At Magh Mela ground, bereft of any VIP trappings, Priyanka walked bare foot with her children and hired a boat for Rs 2,000 to ride to the other bank of Sangam, where she took a holy dip with Rehan and Miraya and offered prayers.

Ignoring the advice of her security men, she took off the life jacket during the boat ride. She gave another scare when she breached the security to meet a few girls who were waving at her.

Priyanka made it a personal trip and refused to answer a volley of questions from media men who were waiting since afternoon. After the holy dip, she went to Mankameshwar temple at Saraswati Ghāt and offered prayers. They had lunch also at the temple.

Priyanka also called on Swami Swaroopanand ji Maharaj, head of Dwarka-Sharda Peeth, and was closeted with him for some time. The swami is known to be vocal against the BJP and the Sangh Parivar.

Her holy dip is seen as party's attempt to adopt a soft Hindutva line to revive Congress fortunes in the Hindi heartland, particularly Uttar Pradesh.

Lord Ram fast becoming richest God in country

Carrying coupons in the denominations of Rs 10, Rs 100 and Rs 1000, these volunteers will reach every household in the country during 'Nidhi Samparpan Abhiyan' to seek contributions for the construction of grand Ram temple at Ayodhya.

After the visit of CM Yogi Adityanath a couple of days ago, the work for digging the foundation of Ram temple has gained momentum. A 15-foot-deep trench has already been dug. The foundation will be 40 to 50 feet deep to ensure that the temple lasts thousands of years and no harm is done even if river Saryu changes its course.

In addition to VHP's old Karyashala at Karsevakuram, a new workshop is being constructed within the 67 acres premises for carving of fresh stones arriving in Ayodhya shortly. Head of the workshop Nikhil Sampura claimed that more artisans will be called from Gujarat and Rajasthan to speed up the carving.

The Ayodhya Development Authority (ADA) too has geared up for making the temple town a world class city as directed by the Chief Minister. The ADA has engaged a Canada-based company along with two Indian firms to prepare the blueprint for beautification of ancient Ayodhya.
