The HSC exams were held from February 21 to March 23, 2023, with 5,033 exam centres across the state for students across all three streams - arts, science and commerce. A total of 14,28,194 students appeared for the examination, with 3,29,337 students appearing from the Mumbai division. Of these, 1,05,749 students were science students, recording a pass percentage of 91.18 per cent. 47,446 students appeared from the arts stream, with a pass percentage of 80.89 per cent while 1,71,509 commerce students took the exam with a pass percentage of 88.15 per cent.

Teen hacked 90,000... Barambe said that the student had only hacked admit cards and no evidence of the question paper being hacked or shared was

found. However, Kamble's lifestyle has raised doubts about his source of income. "Kamble is a student and has no fixed source of income. WHAT THE CASE IS ABOUT The Belapur police registered a case on April 25, after more than 94,000 admit cards for the MPSC non-gazetted group B and Group C cadres' exam were leaked on a Telegram channel. The exam was scheduled on April 30 at 1,475 centres across 37 districts. MPSC Joint Secretary Sunil Harishchandra Avtade approached the Belapur police after he learnt about the illegal downloading of students' admit cards and their being published on the Telegram channel "MPSC 2023 A" on April 23. As per the complainant, a total of 4,66,455 candidates were registered for the examination. The admit card or hall tickets of 94,195 students were downloaded illegally and published on the Telegram channel.

According to police, the admit cards for the examination were made available on the MPSC website on April 21, 2023. Since there were a large number of students, the commission also made available a separate link, 'Admission Certificate' on its website. Through the external link, candidates could download the admit card by mentioning their registered mobile number with the commission and entering the OTP. Kamble used the additional link for the illegal download of admit cards.

Denying sex to spouse...

In July 1994, the couple got mutually separated before a panchayat after the man paid alimony of Rs 22,000 to his wife. She later married another man. Then the husband approached a court seeking divorce on grounds of mental cruelty and desertion. However, the trial court refused to grant divorce on the grounds of cruelty. The aggrieved wife filed an appeal before the Allahabad High Court as a bench of the family court which dismissed his divorce plea. A bench of Justice Suneet Kumar and Justice Rajendra Kumar IV, while granting the husband a decree of divorce, on Thursday said: "Undoubtedly, not allowing a spouse for a long time to have sexual intercourse with his or her partner, without sufficient reason, itself amounts to mental cruelty. Since there is no acceptable view in which a spouse can be compelled to resume life with the consort, nothing is achieved by trying to keep the parties tied forever to a marriage. Terminating the approach taken by the family court as 'hyper-technical', the bench said: "It is evident from the record that since long, the parties to the marriage have been living separately and there had been a complete breakdown of their marriage."

Amul-Aavin milk spat...

"Recently, it has come to our notice that Amul has utilised its multi-state cooperative licence to install chilling centres and establish a processing plant in Krishnagiri and has planned to procure milk through SHGs in and around Krishnagiri, Dharmapuri, Vellore, Ranipet, Tirupathur, Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur districts in our state," he said. Such cross-procurement goes against the spirit of 'Operation White Flood' and will exacerbate problems for consumers given the prevailing milk shortage in the country. This act of Amul infringes on Aavin's milk-shed area, which has been nurtured in the true cooperative spirit over decades. This move by Amul will create unhealthy competition between co-operatives engaged in procuring and marketing milk and milk products," Stalin cautioned. Regional co-operatives have been the bedrock of dairy development in states and are better placed to engage and nurture producers and to cushion consumers from arbitrary price hikes, the union said. It will also ensure that the milk procurement from the milk shed area of Aavin in Tamil Nadu with immediate effect.

Shah in Guwahati...

Clashes broke out in Manipur after a 'Tribal Solidarity March' was organised in the hill districts of the state on May 3 to protest against the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status. The ethnic clashes claimed over 70 lives and some 10,000 army and paramilitary personnel had to be deployed to restore normalcy in the north-eastern state.

FIR for...

The Karnataka Congress unit had filed a police complaint against Narayan but an FIR was not registered.

On Wednesday, a delegation of Congress leaders led by Mysuru District Congress Committee president B Vijayakumar went to Devaraja police station and submitted a fresh complaint, following which an FIR was lodged against the former minister under Sections 506 (punishment for criminal intimidation) and 153 (wantonly giving provocation with intent to cause riot) of the Indian Penal Code. Narayan had claimed that his words were "misconstrued." "I was only alluding to the fact that Congress should be defeated in the 2023 Assembly elections," he had said. The BJP leader said he will face the issue politically as well as legally. "Debate is an integral part of politics & essential for a healthy democracy. It is in this spirit that my words should be interpreted," he tweeted.

'Awahd mastermind'...

In the initial charge sheet, Awahd was shown to have minimal role in the incident, according to sources. However, after the Supreme Court's order, the police claim to have plugged all the loopholes in the initial investigation conducted during the MVA regime. Meanwhile, the body of one of the accused was found under mysterious circumstances on the railway track.

STONEWALLED


It is suspected that the same set of officers were clearing the narcotics consignments for export in the courier parcels of arrested drug trafficker Ali Asgar Shirazi, a senior crime branch officer told the FIU on Thursday. Police investigation has revealed that Shirazi operated a courier company - KMB Courier and the now defunct Continental, in the absence of due diligence by airport customs officers, trafficking party drugs and banned pharmaceuticals to Europe and the US.

Ali Asgar Shirazi frequently visited the Airport Courier terminal even though he faced several NDPS cases, including the 2012-13 airport customs seizure of ketamine and had an Interpol red alert and 'look-out' notices issued by the Mumbai police. "I named another crime branch officer, who was shocked at the easy access the narcotics trafficker had to the sensitive and highly restricted customs courier centre."

Meanwhile, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has asked Mumbai Police to unravel the hawala transactions and investments of Shirazi, who belongs to the Dawood Ibrahim gang. The NIA suspects that money generated from the drug trade has been invested by Dawood in Bollywood and in the hospitality business. The NIA believes that the interrogation of Shirazi will reveal hawala transactions and hawala transfers to Dubai and Pakistan. Police are also probing Shirazi's event management company, which got international artists to perform at its events.

Howrah Bridge to undergo in-depth health checkup

PATNA, KOLKATA The 80-year-old iconic Howrah Bridge, which connects the twin cities of Howrah and Kolkata over the Hooghly river, will undergo a detailed health checkup after a gap of 11 years, said a top official of Kolkata's Urban Development Authority (UDA) on Thursday. The comprehensive health checkup of the cantilever bridge will be done in consultation with IIT, Kharagpur, said the UDA official. Kolkata port chairman Ratanendra Raman said, "The proposed exercise will be taken up in addition to the routine maintenance of the bridge, he said. "We have decided to conduct an in-depth study on the health of the



ARCHAEOLOGISTS FIND NEOLITHIC STONE TOOLS IN HYD

Archaeologists in Hyderabad have recently found rare stone tools, belonging to the neolithic age, with the findings indicating the city's history goes back to about 6,000 years. The Neolithic age relates to the period when humans used tools and weapons made of stone and had just developed farming. It was for the first time that neolithic tools have been found in the city, said E Sivani Reddy, a retired government archaeology official. Reddy, a noted archaeologist and CEO of Panch India Foundation, said he and S Hanagopal, Kotla Telugana Charitra Brundam (an organisation working on the history of Telugana) recently visited a natural rock formation at BNR Hills in the city, locally known as 'torso rock', to explore if there any prehistoric rock paintings when they stumbled upon the said discovery.
